I. Welcome and Meet your Neighbors

II.Approval of Agenda and August Minutes

Agenda amended to include the Best of Boylan project. Moved for approval, seconded. Minutes moved for approval, seconded.

III.Police Report - Officer Di Cello

The past 30 days have seen three 911 calls: a car crash, property damage, and a hang-up. Traffic Calming: After a traffic-calming class, Officer DiCello collected speed-survey data for a 22-day period, on Cabarrus near Boylan Ave. This data can justify allocation of more police resources. He'll place an additional speed survey detector between Cabarrus and Boylan Bridge. Data will be presented at the next meeting. He asked for specific areas of concern re: stop signs. South/Boylan during evening rush hour and Cabarrus/Boylan during morning rush hour were noted. He will arrange for police presence during these times. A Suspicious Person has been seen walking around: on the tracks, at the Platform, on the bridge appearing to stalk women, and on occasion holding a knife. He is described as average height, thin, blond, with a gaunt face. Officer Howard and the ACORN Unit are aware. Officer DiCello says call 911 if this person acts intimidating, whether or not a crime is being committed. Then, let him know later via text or email:

IV.Continuing Business Development Beat: Red Hat Relocation and Closure of South Street: The City Council meeting provided a public citizen comment time-15 minutes allocated for citizens to speak for/against closing South Street. The council listened to input from the convention center managers, the traffic study report, and additional comments from council members. The mayor and the six council members present voted to close South Street. It was noted that while closure of South Street is unfortunate, in order to maintain the schedule for the budget, the only viable solution that met parameters required the closure of South Street. In the future, they acknowledged they need to do a better job of community engagement. Traffic Study: Raleigh Transportation was unable to attend, but plans to present the traffic study at the next BH meeting. The study is comprehensive, long-term (to 2050), macro, and doesn't reflect street level data: youtube.com/watch?v=48uzLLuq7cQ Next Steps: Discussion ensued on how BH might work with other community groups on areas of mutual interest to be more

effective. Attending monthly District D meetings with Jane Harrison and adjoining CAC (citizen advisory council) meetings was suggested. Interested BH residents need to attend these meetings to make their concerns known. Two websites that list times and dates of community meetings, District meetings, CAC meetings, forums, and projects that affect our citizens are Livable Raleigh and One Wake. The Boylan Heights website now includes information on community involvement opportunities and happenings. BH meeting minutes, agendas for meetings, and the by-laws are also posted. V.Financial Report Both BH Association accounts—general operating account and ArtWalk-have healthy balances. Budget for this year was approved by the board at their August meeting. General operating shows a deficit of \$765.00; this is not a true deficit since merchandise purchases will be recouped over multiple years. The ArtWalk budget has a current surplus of \$175.00. For budget details, contact treasurer John Lunsford. IV.New Business By-laws Update: The bylaws have been posted on the BH Website. Some areas are out of date. The Board will be reviewing the bylaws and drafting changes. There will be a period for resident review and input on changes, with a vote to follow. Elected Candidate Forums: One Wake is sponsoring an October 10 candidate forum. Pre-registration is required. See the link below. Charitable Giving Nominations: Part of our mission, as stated in the BH Bylaws, is to support community non-profits with connection to the neighborhood. Donations in the past include the Cecilia Rawlins Fund, Haven House, Project Enlightenment, and Interfaith Food Shuttle. This year the Board has set aside \$500.00 for charitable giving. The main sources of funds for the charitable giving are the proceeds from Best of Boylan and the ArtWalk food booth. Nominations and applications for agencies to receive funds are due by November 15th. Best of Boylan: The Best of Boylan Silent Auction is an annual neighborhood project to raise money for charitable giving. Neighbors donate talent, time, and goods for auction. Don Davis ran the event last year and is excited to train the next event coordinator (volunteer needed!). The event has no set date and can be run at your convenience.
